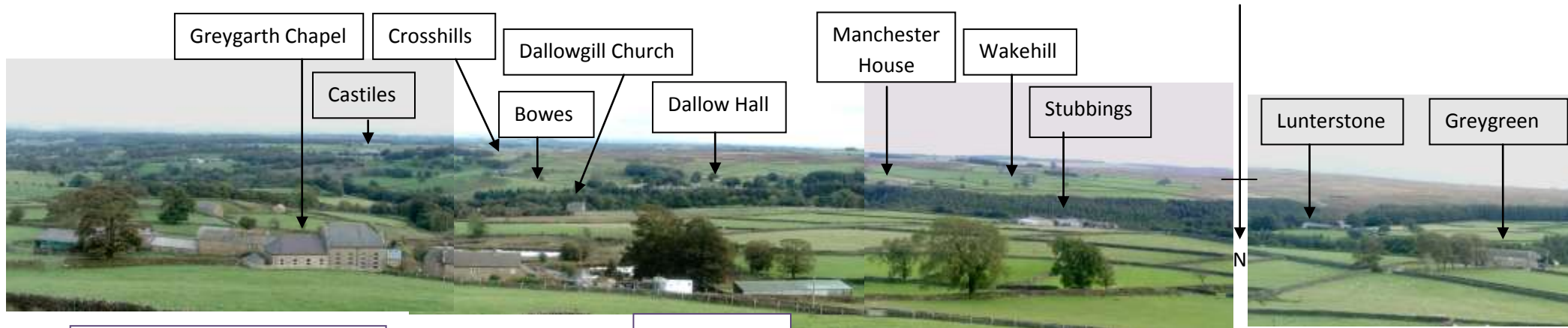


View from the top of Greygarth Monument (Pinnacle)

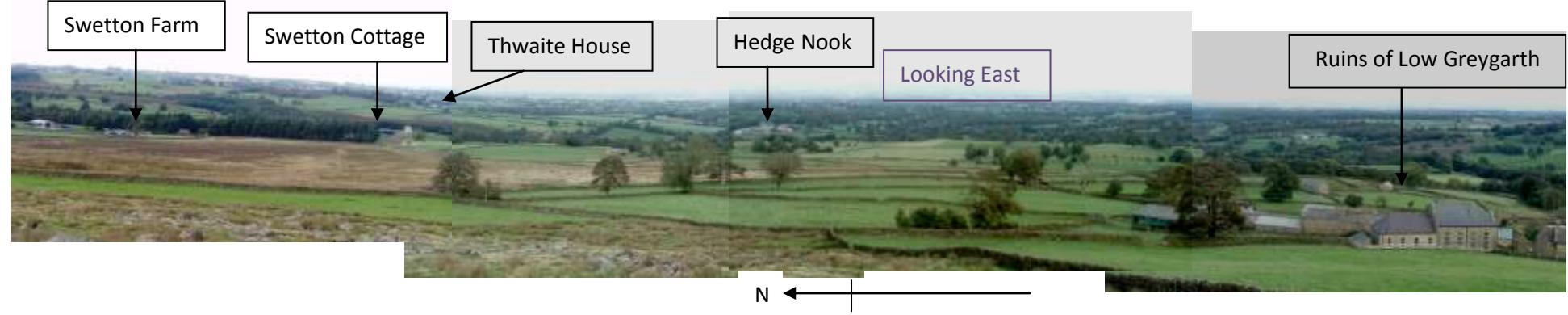


Excerpt from the Ripon Gazette dated Thursday September 27th 1894
